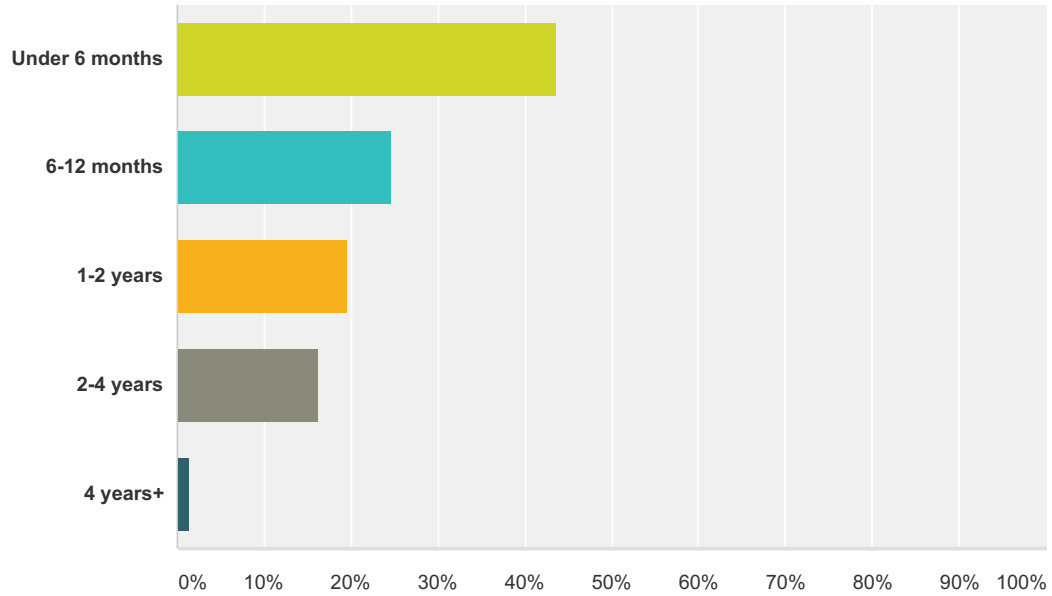


**Q1 How old is the baby/toddler/child you are currently feeding? If tandem feeding, please select multiple options.**

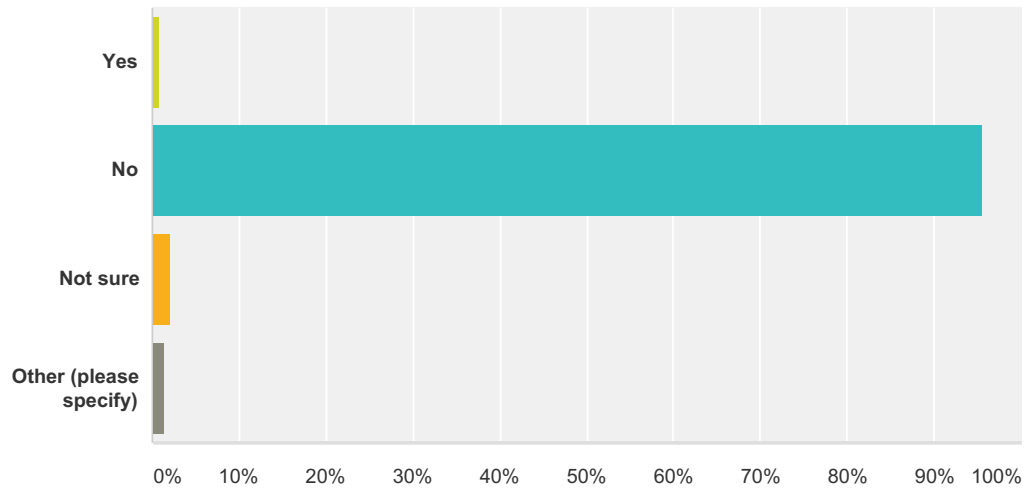

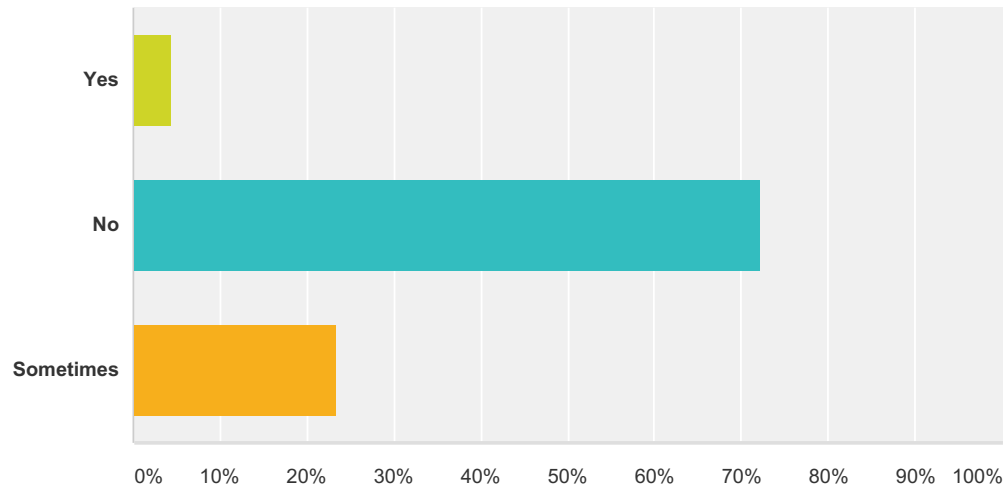

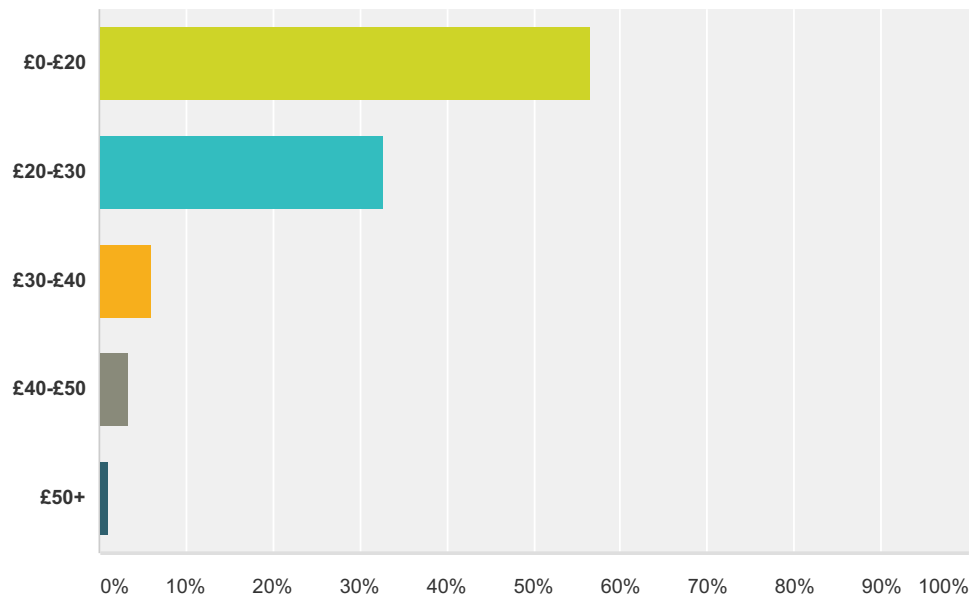

### Q8 How much do you look to spend for a casual day-to-day breastfeeding outfit?

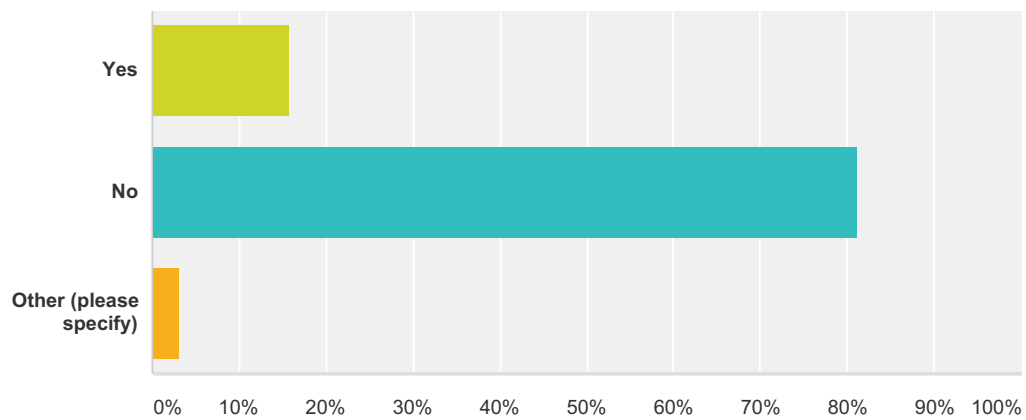

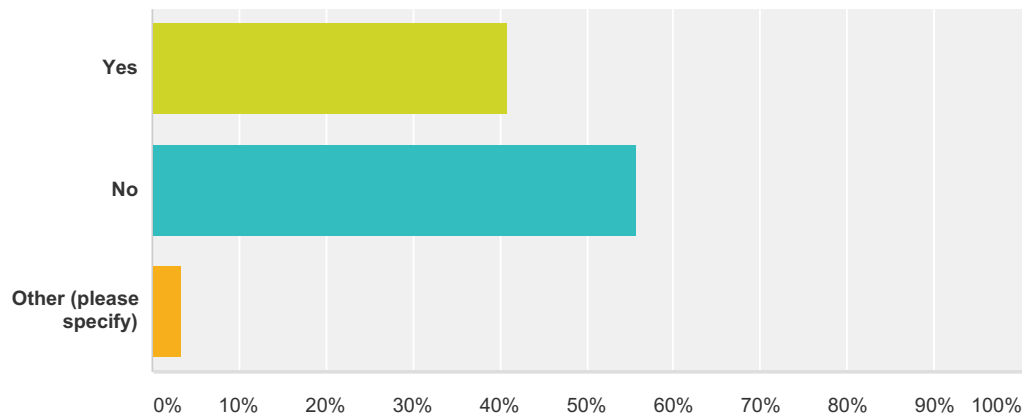
